

Recommendations from Elite Tactical Sales

- To become familiar with the safe operation of your new firearm, first read the manufacturer's owner's manual and any other literature provided with the firearm before removing it from the package. If you have any additional questions or concerns about the operation of your firearm, you should contact the manufacturer.
- Take a firearm safety course to become more familiar with the operation and safe use of your firearm, and ALWAYS follow all of the Firearm Safety Rules listed below.
- Maintain safe storage by keeping your firearms in a secure location preferably in a locked safe while not under your immediate control. You should be aware of the possibility that you could be held liable for any misuse of your firearm either performed by you or by someone other than you. This can also include any actions done with your firearm even if it was stolen from you.
- If you choose to legally carry your firearm concealed in public, you must first obtain any licenses required by the state in which you plan on carrying your firearm in.

Firearm Safety Rules

- 1. Treat all firearms as if they are loaded.** Consider all firearms loaded and handle them as such. Do not believe when someone says: "It's not loaded." Carefully check the firearm for yourself. Also, never pass a firearm to another person unless the cylinder or action is open and you visually check that it is unloaded.
- 2. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot.** Every time you handle a firearm whether it is a handgun or a long gun, grab a hold of the grip or stock firmly but keep your finger outside of the trigger guard. Never put your finger inside the trigger guard until you are pointing the firearm at a target and only then when you are ready to shoot.
- 3. Never point or cover anything with the muzzle of a firearm that you do not intend to shoot.** If you do not want to see a bullet hole in it, do not allow the firearm muzzle to point at it.
- 4. Be sure of your target and what is behind it.** Remember bullets are designed to go through things. Always be aware of your surroundings and the direction in which you are shooting whether on a range, in the woods, or in a defensive situation. Watch your line of fire and always consider your target's background.
